Supporting Early Childhood Programs and Early Educators to serve California's young dual language learners







About the Project:

In support of early childhood programs and early educators, the California Department of Education and CSU Channel Islands is pleased to offer EDUC 490 as a professional development project. The project will build on a commitment by early childhood education (ECE) program directors to improve practices that serve young dual language learners and their families.

Each ECE program will conduct a self-assessment, and will commit to allow teachers to implement new practices and document their experiences.

Designated staff from participating programs will be enrolled in two courses (available in English & Spanish) and will join early educators from across California in completing activities, practicing strategies in their classroom, and sharing experiences by webcam as a community of practice for 16 weeks.

Upon successful completion, participants will earn two units of undergraduate credit from CSU Channel Islands and a \$600 stipend.

Project Format

- Two sequential, one unit undergraduate courses (available in English and Spanish)
- Six to eight weeks per course (total 16 weeks)
- Each course online (webcam) on set day and time weekly
- Mandatory community of practice for each course – participation through additional online meetings
- Zero cost to participants (tuition covered by grant from California Department of Education)
- Two undergraduate CSU units and \$600 stipend per successful completion

Requirements

- Participating ECE programs are licensed to serve infants, toddlers and/or young children by providing family child care and/or preschool.
- Each program serves dual language learners.
- Each ECE program director/site supervisor will attend a mandatory orientation.
- Each ECE program commits to a pre- and postprogram self-assessment.
- Each participant is actively teaching in a classroom.
- Each ECE program will allow and support teachers to implement new practices and document their experiences via photo and video.
- Each participant will have access to an Internetready computer, webcam and microphone.

Preferred Program Characteristics

- · The program serves DLL children
- CDE/ELCD contracted programs
- Participates in Quality Counts Consortium
- · Serving children receiving subsidies

Full Project Launch

- Fall 2019
- Eight cohorts*, 160 participants

Project End

- Spring 2020
- Six cohorts*, 160 participants

Quality Counts Santa Barbara Cohort

- In-person with Dr. Olivia-Olsen and CSUCI instructors
- Targeted site-based strategies
- Limited to 20 participants at QCSB sites
